## Brown turns gold

ighlight of the 750MC's two-day meeting was the Formula Vee Allcomers event which saw the British F. Vee contenders pitted against their Irish counterbarts. Two heats were required either side of the Sunday lunch break to provide a full grid for the final. The boutcome of those heats was honours even. While Padraic Owens claimed victory for Ireland in heat one, British driver Martin Brown put a warm up lap spin behind him to take the win in the second heat.

Another storming start by Brown in the Allcomers F.Vee final saw him 10 car lengths clear of his nearest rival as they rounded Dibeni for the first time. That rival was not in fact Owens, who had made a fairly tardy start, but another Irish competitor in the shape of Pat Duffy. With Owens snapping at his heels, the pair were to provide one of the battles of the race. The promise of an equally thrilling battle for fourth place disappeared with the retirement of Nick Bolton to leave Jonathon Hughes effectively unchallenged for the position.

While the all Irish fight for second place kept the crowd on the edge of their seats, it also meant that they were never able to challenge British leader, Brown. It was Owens who finally secured second spot with a

dramatic final lap dive up the inside of Duffy at Brooklands to round off some terrific Formula Vee racing from both sides of the Irish Sea.

A wrong turning on the warm up lap didn't prevent Andres Serrano from taking an immediate lead in the Volkspares Formula Vee race which kicked off the 750 MC's weekend of racing. A second lap spin at Paddock by Martin Brown then allowed the American to extend the gap and go onto a comfortable win. Meanwhile, a race long three way battle for second place briefly became a four way fight until a second mistake by the recovering Brown on the penultimate lap. That delayed Jonathon Hughes allowed 1991 champion Trevor Welsh to pick up second place, with Nick Bolton third.

The rally prepared RS2000 of Martin Davies managed to hold off the attentions of Colin Gunderson's Porsche 911 and take victory in the Welsh Saloon and Sportscar event. Third place went to the Capri of Blake Edwards despite a spin at Hatchets whilst challenging the Porsche for second spot.

As they battled for the lead, Bob Davis and Alan Hicks pulled away from the rest of the Formula 4 field, Davis managed to open up a small gap in the second half of the race, but as
