All-star invasion

Britain's brightest racing stars cross the Severn Bridge this weekend, bringing racing's most popular circus to Pembrey. Jonathan Gill puts you in the picture

Top of today's bill is the all-star cast of the 1993 Auto Trader RAC British Touring Car Championship. This country's premier race series has already provided plenty of frantic top class entertainment for tens of thousands of race goers and millions of BBC television viewers alike.

And being a true 'British' championship, the BTCC doesn't just strut its stuff at Silverstone and Brands Hatch – this weekend the touring car circus is performing here in Wales and at the end of the next month you'll find the Big Top pitched at Knockhill in Scotland.


For newcomers, the *Auto Trader* RAC British Touring Car Championship is the current success story of British motor sport. Record levels of manufacturer involvement, a set of regulations which provide ultra-close racing and a superb promotional package having combined to deliver thrilling racing which is now attracting crowds which would do many premier league football clubs proud.

The bedrock on which the thrill-a-minute BTCC is built is a set of cleverly-engineered technical regulations. In simple terms these rules stipulate that cars must be saloons over 4.2 metres long with engines up to 2 litres in capacity. This encourages the use of familiar family saloons (both front and rear-wheel drive) which has enormous appeal to

motoring marketeers – hence the vast array of manufacturers now contesting the championship. BMW, Ford, Mazda, Nissan, Peugeot, Renault, Toyota and Vauxhall are already involved, while Alfa Romeo, Audi, Mercedes and a host of others are watching with keen interest.

Leading the way in 1993 is the crack Schnitzer BMW team whose star driver line-up of **Joachim Winkelhock** and **Steve Soper** currently top the series points standings. Soper started the season in fine style but the fearless German isn't about to capitulate. 'Smokin' Jo' has won three of the last four races and only trails his team-mate by a scant three points – a situation Winkelhock will be keen to reverse this weekend. There are no team orders at BMW so expect civil war and plenty of fireworks!

Last year's Manufacturers' Champion Vauxhall seems best-placed to challenge dominant BMW. The Vauxhall Sport Cavaliers of **Jeff Allam** and **John Cleland** have both chased the 318is hard throughout the first seven races and two fine second place finishes underline the team's determination.

However, last time out, it was the blue and white Ecurie Ecosse Cavalier of **David Leslie** which spearheaded Luton's attack. While most of the front runners rely on Yokohama tyres, Ecurie Ecosse races on Dunlop rubber . . . and, at Brands Hatch, the Dunlops seemed to have the edge. Indeed, Leslie was leading the first of two races staged at the Kentish circuit until forced into a spin by Winkelhock . . . a move which cost the hard-charging German an endorsement on his racing licence.

The new Toyota Carina E GTis of former champion **Will Hoy** and ex-grand prix man **Julian Bailey** have also started to challenge the mighty BMWs. Indeed Hoy, the lap record holder here at Pembrey, also led at Brands Hatch but not when it counted . . . at the chequered flag.

Nissan is another Japanese giant seeking glory in the *Auto Trader* RAC British Touring Car Championship. **Kieth Odor**

recorded the team's best ever results wit two excellent second places at Brand Hatch; he's backed up by both vetera saloon car wizard **Win Percy** and TV statistical transfer of the years the well know *Top Gear* presenter has made several came appearances in the series but now has his paws on a Primera eGT for the rest of the season.

Mazda is represented too – **Patric Watts** lines up in the good-looking Xedos 6 pronounced Cur-cee-dos, if you wer wondering! The sweet sounding V6 machin has already caused a stir or two . . . notabl when it qualified on pole position for roun three at Snetterton.

Touch wood, this weekend's field will b swelled by the arrival of two more six cylinder challengers. Several months agrord announced its intention to enter th BTCC fray and preparation specialist **And Rouse** has been working overtime to read a pair of Mondeos for action. All being wel these exciting Mondoes will make their rac debuts here at Pembrey; Rouse will pilot one Kiwi star **Paul Radisich** the other.

Aside from Messrs Soper and Winkelhock, the only other man to win BTCC race in 1993 is reigning champion Tim Harvey. Having left BMW at the end clast season, he now lines up alongside Swis star Alain Menu at the promising nev Renault equipe. Although the bright yellow cars are still midfield runners in draconditions, they go like Class 1 powerboat in the wet. Harvey's victory, which owed a lot of Michelin's grippy grooved tyres, came as a soaking Donington Park back in April.

Renault isn't France's only representative the Tricolore is also waved by Peugeo whose 405 Mi16 has shown plenty o promise without delivering much in the way of silverware . . . yet! Robb Gravett, the 1990 champion, heads the driving force which also includes Eugene O'Brien and charismatic Ian Flux who races a semi works machine prepared by Roy Kennedy Racing.

Two rising young chargers, namely **James Kaye** and **Bobby Verdon-Roe** join forces at another semi-works set-up, the Park Lake Toyota Junior Team, whose distinctive green and white Carinas are generally right in the thick of the midfield action.

While these factory-backed teams battle i out for outright glory up front, severa enthusiastic privateers are also seeking honours in the TOCA Challenge Cup – a special race within a race for drivers no receiving backing from a manufacturer.

Former F1 driver Ian Ashley currently heads the standings in his Vauxhall Cavalie but Matthew Neal (BMW), Ian Khar (Vauxhall) and Ian Cantwell (Mazda 323F) are all chasing hard. Look out, too, for the BMWs of David Pinkney, Alex Portmar and former Le Mans winner Andy Wallace

The form book may point to anothe BMW victory, but don't bet on it. Remembe both Vauxhall and Toyota had their noses ir front at Brands Hatch and the fine-handling Nissans are sure to be on the pace too Whoever eventually comes out on top, ar exhilarating race is guaranteed.


