

NIGEL Greensall finally finished the job he came to do last year by winning the RAC BOSS Superprix in front of a packed crowd on the new-look Mondello Park International Circuit.


Greensall started from the pitlane in his spare Tyrrell 022 after crashing his 023 version in qualifying.

The Footworks of poleman Ron Cumming and third placed Klaas Zwart stalled on the line allowing Tony Worswick's Jordan 194 and the F3000 Reynard 95D of Sarah Kayanagh to lead the early going.

Greensall was right with Worswick after seven laps but the Lancastrian wasn't about to give in easily. Worswick eventually spun six laps later at turn three and Greensall managed to find a way past the stricken Jordan via the grass, all of which left him clear to cruise on to victory.

Kavanagh held off the Tyrrell of Rob Gray until an errant backmarker reduced the gap. However, Gray passed her under yellow flags and incurred a stop/go penalty, so Kavanagh completed the podium after all. Another Reynard 95D, this driven by Duncan Gray, finished fourth ahead of the unsorted Pacific of Geoff Farmer.

The Dunlop Stryker race that opened proceedings was decided


were next up, while Michael Keohane had to work his way back to fifth past Swedish visitor John Stambeck after clashing with Noel Dunne.
