## Wet track doesn't stop Gareth

GARETH REES scored a valuable point with a fighting sixth place in the latest round of the European Formula 3000 championship at Hockenheim on Saturday, after a strong drive in changeable conditions.

Rees was disappointed to find himself in 13th place on the grid after practice, but with rain sweeping the track the race was stopped and restarted following an accident involving several backmarkers.

After the restart the rain stopped and the track began to dry out, but the mayhem continued with cars leaving the circuit everywhere.

"We started again behind the pace car but as the track dried out the timing

of the pitstop was going to be crucial,' Rees explained.

"Unfortunately, my team took their time about calling me in and I reckon I lost an even better placing. Even so, I am reasonably happy. Finishing sixth after starting 13th is a good result after such a difficult race.

"Hockenheim when it is raining is not a nice place – the spray hangs in the air and doing 170mph when it's like that becomes a bit scary."

The next race in the European Formula 3000 championship is in Hungary in two weeks' time.
