



## Kempe now seventh

Rhiwderin's Phil Kempe moved into joint seventh place in the Marlboro British Formula Three championship after picking up another point in the eighth round at Thruxton on Monday.

Kempe started from twelfth place on the grid and was soon involved in an entertaining battle with American Jo Foster and Briton Andrew Gilbert-Scott, but with crashes and spins accounting for five of the front runners, Kempe's race soon became one for points, the Identicar eventually taking sixth place.

Next round is at Silverstone on June 8 and 9.

## Kempe can progress

Rhiwderin's Phil Kempe looks in good shape for the eighth round of the Marlboro British Formula Three championship at Thruxton on Monday after an intense period of testing.

His Identicar Ralt was fifth in the last round but Kempe shrugged it off, saying: "Our development has caught up with the others."

## Kempe fifth

RHIWDERIN'S Phil Kempe picked up the first points needed en route towards his Grand Prix ambitions with a convincing performance in the third round of the 1985 Marlboro British Formula Three Championship at Silverstone yesterday.

From his place on the second row of the grid, Kempe made a good start, but thoughts of a top three place disappeared in a tense barging match at Copse Corner.

By the end of the first lap, Kempe was comfortably established in fifth place and, despite coming under heavy pressure, finished in that position.
