Davies was fastest in the first prac-tice, but slipped to third behind Andy Wallace and pole position man Gerrit Van Kouwen in the second session.

When the race started Davies quickly settled into a comfortable third place after fending off a first lap chal-lenge from Keith Fine. The leaders were stretching out, and were five seconds up on Davies at half distance.

Fine and series leader Sandro Sala were close behind Davies as he entered the chicane on the last lap, and he took third place five tenths of a second ahead of Fine.

Davies said, "I thought the race had already finished." But he looked glad to be back on the rostrum for the first time in almost 12 months. The next race is at Donington on May 18.
