Davies went well in testing on Friday but explained: "We could not break through to repeat the performance in

Even so Davies qualified faster than the Swallow teams other cars driven by Schonstrom and King and for once his luck was in when he avoided a four car pile up at the first corner on the opening lap of the 20 lap race.

"I could see cars everywhere and I braked several times to avoid them. I expected to be hit myself but no one touched

me. It was close!'

After the race settled down Davies found himself on his own some way behind the leading bunch but well clear of the rest and profited from some more retirements to take a strong 11th place despite having his attention diverted when the fire extinguisher came loose.

Even so he was well clear Schontron and King's

Swallow Reynards, proving himself and the "own brand" car a better prospect than those they bought.

In the race Martin Donnelly, a former Swallow driver, won at a canter from title leader Johnny Herbert who extended his lead with a hard fought second place.

Afterwards Davies revealed an almost unique problem that will keep him out of the Birmingham Super Prix. "I have the budget but we cannot find a suitable car. Even so I will be talking to the teams to try and make it plain that I intend to break into Formula 3000 next year. In the meantime Davies will take the Swallow for further racing and testing at Silver-stone on August Bank Holiday Monday.
